
We look forward to holding an open house this Fall to welcome the public into the new space. Keep an eye on our social media for more information.

Operations Center

Celebration High School's Student Government Election

Outreach staff visited Celebration
High School on Wednesday, April 26
to conduct their student government
election. All freshmen, sophomores
and juniors were eligible voters and
had the chance to select their class
officers. Our office created an official
ballot and brought two tabulation
machines so students could get a
feel for how real elections look.

Students checked in, signed their names, and received a ballot.

Special Election Coming This Year

In June, Florida House of Representatives Member Fred Hawkins, resigned from his seat. A special election will have to be held to fill this seat. Mr. Hawkins represented District 35. This district encompasses parts of both Osceola and Orange Counties. Osceola County voters who live in this district include voters in Narcoossee, Kenansville, Harmony and surrounding areas. Voters can determine which district they live in by checking their voter information card, checking their voter status online or by calling the elections office.

Dates for the special election have not been set at this time. There will be a primary and a general election. Both elections will have an Early Voting period prior to Election Day. Voters can also Vote by Mail. Any voter who has already requested their mail ballot for the 2024 cycle will automatically receive a mail ballot for the special election. Anyone who is unsure whether they've requested a Vote by Mail ballot, can check their Vote by Mail status online or call the office. Vote by Mail requests can be made online, in person and over the phone.

Recent Events

April

Outreach staff was very busy this month with high school voter registration and Sunshine State Young Reader elections at elementary and middle schools. You could've also spotted them at the Caribbean Fusion Festival on April 23 in Kissimmee.

Four staff members attended a national workshop with the Election Center. The Election Center is the National Association of Election Professionals. At this workshop, election professionals from across the country were discussing ways to better train and educate employees, election workers and, also, voters.

May

Three staff members and Supervisor Arrington attended the Florida Supervisors of Elections conference in Sanibel May 21-25. This is an annual meeting of all 67 counties to discuss changes in the law and learn best practices.

Secretary of State Cord Byrd was a speaker at this event.



Outreach staff was out and about in the community again this month with a visit to Hope CARES Day on May 15, the Osceola County Employee Health Fair on May 16, and Osceola County's Before the Storm Event in Kissimmee on May 20. Two Election Worker Mini Sessions were held in May.
